

### Instructions/Reminders for Running the Dan Meyer Video, Day 3 Session 3

You will need speakers to connect to your laptop unless they are already installed at your site.

There are a number of ways to play this video. Please experiment before your academy to choose the best way for you to play it. You will need to check on the set-up day to make sure it is working at your site.

A copy of the video with subtitles is on D2L. You will need to have internet access to open D2L and to play the video from that site. We suggest that you run the version with subtitles for all audiences.

On the rehearsal day a member of the MSDE Mathematics Team will give you a copy of the Dan Meyer video presentation on a CD. **If you are teaching multiple academies you will be given a CD at your first academy ONLY. It will be necessary for you to bring your copy of the CD to any future assignments.** We've found this to be the best way to show the video but that's really up to you.

Depending on the computer and operating system that you use, here are some hints to help make things run smoothly.

Download the video onto your desktop from the CD.

- Open the video. If it comes up right away and plays, you're good to go.
- If a pop-up note says you don't have the program to run the video, download QuickTime. It's free...just Google (any search engine will work) QuickTime. It will have a list of operating systems. Choose the download for the operating system you are running.
- Sometimes a pop-up note says that you don't have the program and you know you have QuickTime. If that happens, open QuickTime first and then open the video.
- If you have a Mac, the video should run automatically as soon as you open it, but, if not, use the instructions above and download QuickTime for Macintosh.
- If you have Real Player, the video should run automatically as soon as you open it, also.
